An important activity that was presided over by Ahsan Iqbal was the launch ceremony of the report titled "Going Digital for Development,"

Ahsan Iqbal brought to light that the government has the responsibility to bridge the digital divide across all regions, as it aligns with the transformative potential of digital economy which sheds light on critical aspects of development, including digital inclusion.

UNDP report of 2023-24 also highlighted the government's commitment to leveraging its insights for national development.

Pakistan stands as the fourth-largest contributor to the global digital freelancing industry.

Some past key milestones identified by Minister Planning, to boost Pakistan's digital development journey.

- Deregulation of the telecommunications industry in 1993
- Introduction of 3G/4G licenses in 2013
- Pakistan's first digital policy in 2021

Ahsan Iqbal highlighted the need of opting a pro-active strategy that will be for embracing and anticipating digital transformation, rather than succumbing to it, by opting for a reactive strategy.

Major Ecosystem of Innovation in Higher Education

A significant meeting on the innovation Ecosystem in Higher education attended by Prof. Ahsan Iqbal, Mr. Steve Smith, the UK Government's International Education Champion, High-ups of British High Commission including James Hampson (County Director Pakistan), and Jo Moir (Director of Development).



This important meeting identified and proposed some key areas of collaboration, which include:

- Enhancing collaboration between educational institutions in both countries.
- Initiating faculty training programs to bolster academic expertise across borders
- Encouraging UK universities to establish campuses in Pakistan
- Harnessing the expertise of Pakistani scholars in UK universities
- Facilitating stronger academia-to- masses connections
- Emphasized the importance of establishing joint research groups
- Need for streamlined regulation; minimizing hurdles for universities and strengthening the link between research institutions and economic growth.

In line of Ahsan Iqbal's vision, Performance Audit Framework has already been introduced in 2023 to improve the quality of higher education in Pakistan. It promotes collaboration, quality enhancement, and academic integrity.



Efforts are underway to categorize Pakistan's Universities in Champions League and the National League.

To review administrative matters of Narowal Sports City, Minister for Planning chaired a meeting, with other attendees including Prof. Dr. Muhammad Younis (VC University of Narowal), Nadeem Irshad Kayani (Secretary for Inter Provincial Coordination), Zahoor Ahmed (DG Pakistan Sports Board), Syed Hasan Raza (DC Narowal), and Farooq Azam (Focal Person Narowal Sports City).

Review of Chinese Investment Projects

Conducive business environment and facilitating the investors is fundamentally important. In line of this, Federal Minister for Planning Prof. Ahsan Iqbal chaired first Cabinet Committee on Chinese Investment Projects (CCoCIP).

Some of the majorly emphasized areas were:

- Strategies to ensure the security of Chinese nationals in Pakistan
- Security measures for Chinese to harness confidence, not the fear.
- Deliberation on the overdue issues of Chinese Independent Power Producers (IPPs)
- Instructions for IPPs to submit their due amounts in the context of CPEC energy projects.
- Providing electricity to SEZs at an incentivized cost
- Conducting a comparative study on the modus operandi of SEZs in regional countries.
- Exploring possibilities for the creation of export processing zones

Meeting also deliberated on the potential areas of enhanced cooperated with China in upcoming Joint Cooperation Committee (JCC). Joint Working Groups (JWGs) will finalize projects for JCC meeting. Federal government and JWGs will ensure major focus on the national agenda.

2nd Phase of CPEC: Emphasis on Business-to-Business Partnerships

To explore opportunities for enhanced bilateral cooperation and mutual growth, 35 Chinese enterprises and Pakistani business houses were invited by Minister for Planning.

Some of the key decision to facilitate Chinese investors:

- Regular meetings every two months to address pending issues promptly
- Facilitating conducive business environments throughout the country for Chinese Investors
- Federal Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FPCCI) to establish a specialized quality control mechanism to verify the credibility of Pakistani businesses for potential Chinese partners.
- Unwavering commitment to safeguarding Chinese interests
