With more robust and comprehensive data, Pakistan can make better resource allocation decisions, strengthen accountability, and drive impactful interventions at both the national and provincial levels.

One of the biggest challenges identified in the SDGs Status Report 2023 is the lack of inter-agency coordination. Development efforts are often fragmented, with limited collaboration among ministries, provincial governments, and international partners. By improving policy coherence and coordination, Pakistan can achieve faster, more sustainable progress toward SDG implementation.

Sustainable development is a collective responsibility—one that requires the efforts of government, private sector, civil society, and international partners. With a shared vision, strategic action, and unwavering commitment, Pakistan can build a resilient, inclusive, and prosperous future for all.

FOREWORD

The 'SDG Status Report 2023' is the second report focusing on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). It provides a thorough overview of the baseline and latest values for 153 SDG headline indicators. Additionally, the report tracks the progress made since 2015 on 107 national headline indicators. The status report is useful for monitoring the SDGs regularly. Given that survey source data and many social sector indicators do not significantly change annually, a comprehensive SDGs report can only be published every 2 to 3 years. However, updates such as the inclusion of new indicators, PSDP and ADP spending, new programs, and changes in legislation and policies should be reported annually in the Annual Plan to ensure continuous monitoring of the SDGs.

'SDG Status Report 2023' presently reports a total of 153 headline indicators which is 20 more indicators than SDGs Status Report 2021. We may increase the indicators significantly in the next SDGs status report. Source of the data is mentioned on the left; thus possible disaggregation of the indicators may be available from the original source.

In this report we are reporting data from national survey sources, administrative sources and international sources. As well as we have tried to show where we stand, what's our progress and what's the ultimate target by 2030. The report does not aim to reflect on sectoral priorities. Nevertheless, it provides the overall progress of SDGs on available indicators. Overall the progress is slow that shows enormous challenges in the decade of action to achieve SDGs by 2030.

Due to lower growth, lower financing and higher inflation and unemployment as well as lower investment by private sector and public sector, we are expecting a reduction in acceleration in SDGs performance. However, in the next couple of years we will have new poverty and inequality estimates that will provide actual progress on different SDGs indicators including food security, health, education, sanitation, gender empowerment and equality, inequality, energy and connectivity.

INTRODUCTION

The **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Status Report 2023** serves as a critical tool for monitoring Pakistan's progress toward achieving the 2030 Agenda. By leveraging a data-driven approach, the report assesses progress across 17 goals and their associated targets and indicators, providing an essential tool for policymakers and stakeholders. The benchmarks established in the report enable a critical analysis of achievements and gaps, facilitating informed policy adjustments and strategic resource allocation to accelerate progress.

The report provides an analysis of **154 out of the 247 global SDG indicators**, drawing data from three key sources:

surveys, administrative records, and international repositories like the World Development Indicators (WDI) and UNESCAP. The exclusion of certain indicators highlights persistent challenges, including **data unavailability**, the inherently international nature of some metrics, and the absence of comprehensive provincial data integration. This approach not only reflects the nation's progress and gaps in achieving the SDGs but also underscores the critical need for **informed policy adjustments and efficient resource allocation** to address these shortcomings effectively.

INSIGHTS AND TRENDS

The SDGs Status Report 2023 presents a mixed picture of Pakistan's performance. Among the **154 indicators analysed**, the data is derived from **32% survey-based sources, 44% administrative data**, and 24% international sources (see Table 1 for Goal wise availability). However, significant data gaps exist due to outdated survey cycles, such as the **Pakistan Demographic and Health**


Survey (PDHS), which was last conducted in 2017-18, and the **Household Integrated Economic Survey (HIES)**, which has not been updated since 2018-19. This has left critical areas, such as poverty, inequality, health, and unemployment, without updated metrics, especially in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, floods, and economic recession.

Indicator Reported – Goal-wise



While 30% of indicators lack explicit progress measurements due to single data points, analysis of the remaining 70% reveals distinct trends. Roughly one-third of these indicators show improvement, particularly in areas like No Poverty, Zero Hunger, and Affordable and Clean Energy. Conversely, another one-third reflects a decline, notably in Good Health and Well-being, Decent Work and

Economic Growth, and Partnerships for the Goals. Stagnation is evident in sectors like Quality Education, highlighting the urgent need for targeted interventions. and Economic Growth, and Partnerships for the Goals. The absence of recent perception-based indicators further complicates the analysis. For example, indicators like "Proportion of population that feel safe walking alone at night" require comprehensive surveys, but resource limitations following the 2023 Census have delayed their collection. In addition, delays in launching regular surveys, including the next HIES expected in 2024-25, mean that crucial data remains unavailable for extended periods, hindering timely decision-making. Coordination among ministries and agencies remains a significant challenge, particularly for areas like climate change and security. However, recent

consultations during the Mid-Term Review of SDGs highlighted the potential to calculate progress on an additional 46 indicators through improved administrative data coordination, particularly with the Ministries of Climate Change and Interior.

The report emphasizes the importance of regional and provincial data to better understand localised progress and challenges. However, the current report does not provide detailed provincial estimates for regions such as Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan. Publishing dedicated provincial or combined reports could address this gap, offering a more

nuanced view of SDG progress across diverse regions.

The SDGs Status Report 2023 provides a critical reflection of Pakistan's progress, offering insights into achievements and persistent challenges. By addressing data gaps, improving coordination, and prioritising underperforming areas, Pakistan can ensure a

more resilient and inclusive approach to sustainable development. This report serves not only as an accountability tool but also as a guide for future planning, helping the country stay on track to meet its SDG commitments by 2030.



Proportion of population below the international poverty line according to \$(PPP) 2.15/day



Proportion of population living below the national poverty line (CBN Approach)









Direct economic loss attributed to disasters






Proportion of local governments that adopt and implement local disaster risk reduction strategies in line with national disaster risk reduction strategies







Prevalence of undernourishment





Prevalence of moderate or severe food insecurity in the population, based on the Food Insecurity Experience Scale (FIES)













The agriculture orientation index for government expenditures







Maternal mortality ratio per 100,000






























Participation rate in organized learning (one year before the official primary entry age), by sex











Proportion of schools offering basic services, by type of service








Proportion of women aged 20-24 years who were married before age 15 and before age 18











Degree of integrated water resources management (0-100%)











Domestic material consumption, per capita








Total resource flows for development, (USD Million)







Total green house gas emissions per year (Million Tons)












Number of victims of intentional homicide per 100,000 population, by sex and age





Proportions of positions in national and local institutions, compared to National distributions (females Ratio)




